

Longyard Golf Course & The Mill Tavern, Greg Norman Drive, Hillvue, NSW 2340

Longyard Golf's Windmill Tavern (The Mill) adjoins Tamworth's Sporting Precinct beside Tamworth's highest growth residential area (Arcadia development). It features a full hotel licence, bistro, lounge area, outdoor seating, and a kids' playground. Included in the sale is a 7.5% share in the adjacent 99-lot MHE development which incorporates the land, the development profits of the initial build, plus management profits in perpetuity. Furthermore, 3 hectares (approx.) of surrounding land is approved for subdivision, prime for masterplanning of premium golf coursefrontage residential &/or resort accommodation - Tamworth Regional Council supports rezoning to R1, including for 3-storey apartment living (rezoning proposal for which is included in TRC's new 2022 LEP). This parcel offers the last remaining piece of golf course-frontage land available for development in Tamworth. In addition, there are 3 luxury townhouses with secure gated entry & golf course views - 2 x doublestorey 4 bedroom/3 bathroom & 1 x single-storey 2 bedroom/1 bathroom - currently utilised as owner accommodation & 2 private rentals. The Longyard Golf Course is currently zoned RE2, suitable for immediate build of resort-style accommodation. It is an 18-hole championship course, Par 72, designed by Greg Norman & Bob Harrison, with a reputation as one of New South Wales' best regional courses. It includes 'Thorny's Putt-Putt' an 18- hole mini golf facility adjoining the Windmill Tavern.
